



## DISCIPLINE CASE SUMMARY

- a. Charles Hambley Morrison (DOB: 1939.11.07)

- b. Professional Misconduct.
- c. The hearing was held April 30, 1997, in the board room of the College. The report and recommendations of the hearing panel were presented to Council on August 21, 1997.
- d. The citation alleged that Charles Hambley Morrison during 1975 and 1976, while employed as a secondary school teacher, engaged in inappropriate or improper activity with a female student at the same school including meeting alone in his car, passing “secret notes” at school to make arrangements to meet and providing her with alcohol. The citation further alleged sexual activity with the same student including sexual comments about her body, kissing and fondling her body.
- e. The hearing panel determined that Charles Hambley Morrison had engaged in an inappropriate sexual relationship with a student while he held a position of trust. The panel considered that this relationship constituted a serious breach of the trust placed in members of the profession and found Charles Hambley Morrison guilty of professional misconduct.
- f. The panel recommended that Charles Hambley Morrison’s certificate of qualification be cancelled. Mr. Morrison consented to this recommendation. Mr. Morrison submitted his resignation from membership in the College of Teachers on November 15, 1994.
