DISCIPLINE CASE SUMMARY

a. A Member (92-A)

b. Professional Misconduct.

c. The report and recommendations of the hearing panel were presented to Council on June 18, 1992.

d. The citation alleged that a member committed professional misconduct in connection with pleading guilty to nine counts of sexual assault involving boys, ranging in age from eight to ten years, which assaults occurred between September 1989 and May 1990. In February 1991 the member was found guilty of all nine counts and sentenced to three years imprisonment for each, to be served concurrently.

The events leading to the criminal conviction took place while the respondent was employed as a teacher in an elementary school. Eight of the nine children were his students. The member was suspended by his school board after being charged and his employment was terminated following his conviction.

e. The College of Teachers found the member guilty of professional misconduct and determined that his membership in the College of Teachers be terminated and his certificate of qualification be cancelled. No costs were assessed against the member.
