DISCIPLINE CASE SUMMARY

a. A Member (92-H)

b. Conduct Unbecoming a Member.

c. The report and recommendations of the hearing panel were presented to Council on March 11, 1993.

d. The citation alleged that a member committed conduct unbecoming a member in connection with a crime of sexual abuse of a child under the age of sixteen years which occurred in August of 1991. The member was charged and plead guilty to this charge. The court imposed a sentence of five years, which was suspended, and a further term of five years supervised probation was given.

The events leading to the criminal conviction took place while the respondent was employed as a Vice Principal in a British Columbia school district. The child involved was a former student of the member.

e. The College of Teachers found the member guilty of conduct unbecoming a member and determined that the persons membership in the College of Teachers be terminated and her/his certificate of qualifications be cancelled. No costs of the hearing were assessed against the member.
