



DISCIPLINE CASE SUMMARY

a. Jacques Henri Vaneden (DOB: 30.10.04)

b. Conduct Unbecoming a Member.

c. The report and recommendations of the hearing panel were presented to Council on March 26, 1992.

d. The citation alleged that Jacques Henri Vaneden committed conduct unbecoming a member in connection with pleading guilty to five counts of indecent assault and two counts of sexual assault involving six children, five male and one female ranging from age nine to twelve years, which assaults occurred between the years 1971 and 1983. In February 1988 he was found guilty of all seven counts and sentenced to five years imprisonment for each, to be served concurrently.

The events leading to the criminal conviction took place while the respondent was employed as a teacher and/or principal in Whitehorse. The children involved were not his students. Three were in his foster care, two others were in foster care, but not that of the accused, and the accused was the Cub leader of one of the victims.

e. The College of Teachers found Jacques Henri Vaneden guilty of conduct unbecoming a member and determined that his membership in the College of Teachers be terminated and his certificate of qualification be cancelled. Because Mr. Vaneden avoided the process of citation service, costs related to service of citation were assessed against him. Mr. Vaneden applied for, and was granted, early retirement in 1987.
